Bidwell Park was established July 20, 1905 through the donation by Annie Bidwell of approximately 2,500 acres of land to the City of Chico. Since that time, the total park size today is 3,670 acres (nearly 11 miles in length), making it one of the largest municipal parks in the U.S.. Bicyclists, joggers, skaters and pedestrians share the wide, paved street unbothered by motor vehicles. Trails, both in Lower and Upper Park, for mountain biking, horseback riding and hiking.
